
Notice of City Employment

Applications with resumes accepted from January 8th, 2024 to January 11th, 2024 (4:30pm)

Position: Assistant Utility Operator-Department of Public Works (Up to 2 positions)

Work Hours: Various depending on needs of the City (May be assigned variable and additional hours in cases of emergency, sickness, vacation, and operational needs)

Salary: \$18.50 per hour without city health insurance \$17.50 with city health insurance (\$1.00 per hour after obtaining a CDL Class A)

(\$1 per hour raise after obtaining the required water license, \$1 per hour for the class 4 wastewater license and \$1 per hour for class 3 wastewater license) More details on the licenses will be discussed before filling of position.

Position includes 100% employer paid health insurance for employee, paid holidays and other earned time off

Duties:

- Utility personnel are required to read meters in an efficient and timely manner,
- Perform all routine maintenance, services and perform general repairs of the utility system (water and sewer) as required by the Supervisor/Mayor.
- All major repairs shall be coordinated with the Supervisor/Mayor and with extra help if needed.
- Mowing shall be required on all rights-of-way and city property as directed by the Supervisor and/or Mayor.
- Street Department work (laborer, equipment operator) as directed by the supervisor
- Other duties as assigned by the Supervisor and/or Mayor.

Minimum job requirements:

- It is required that the employee obtain their class D IEPA water license within 12 months from start of employment.
- It is required that the employee obtain class 4 IEPA wastewater license within 12 months of start of employment.
- It is required that the employee obtain their class 3 IEPA wastewater license within 24 months.
- Failure to acquire needed Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's certification during this period may result in termination of employment.
- Class A CDL preferred. The City will train and pay for obtaining the CDL licensing. Must be acquired within 6 months of date of hire. Failure to obtain a CDL during this period may result in termination of employment.
